# singerbread boy

## WHAT YOU NEED

Body - 1/4 yd. brown prairie cloth Pocket - fabric 3" X width of fabric Polyester stuffing Cream pearl cotton or embroidery floss Three 1/2" buttons Powder blush



Finished size- 6 1/2"
Instructions- for one
1/4" seam allowance is included

#### **BODY**

- 1. On two layers of fabric, with right sides together, trace around the body shape using a fine black felt tip pen.
- 2. Make a slit through one layer fabric as indicated on the pattern.
- 3. Sew on the traced line.
- 4. Trim seam allowance to 1/4" and clip corners.
- 5. Turn right side out through the slit and stuff with polyester stuffing.

### **FACE**


- 1. Make French knots for the eyes with Pearl cotton or you could also use embroidery floss.
- 2. To make your gingerbread boy look a little ragged and worn, stitch along the seams with a few stitches sewn across the seam.
- 3. Brush a small amount of powder blush on the cheeks.

#### **POCKET**

- 1. Cut two pieces of fabric 2 1/2" x 2 1/2".
- 2. With right sides together, sew the square together around all sides, 1/4" seam allowance.
- 3. Cut a small slit at the lower end of one of the squares, cutting only through one layer.
- 4. Turn right side out through the slit. Press.
- 5. Sew a button to the front of the pocket.
- 6. Sew the pocket to the gingerbread boy over the slit on the body by sewing irregular stitches across the edge of the pocket using Pearl cotton.
- 7. Add a cinnamon stick and greenery to the pocket.
